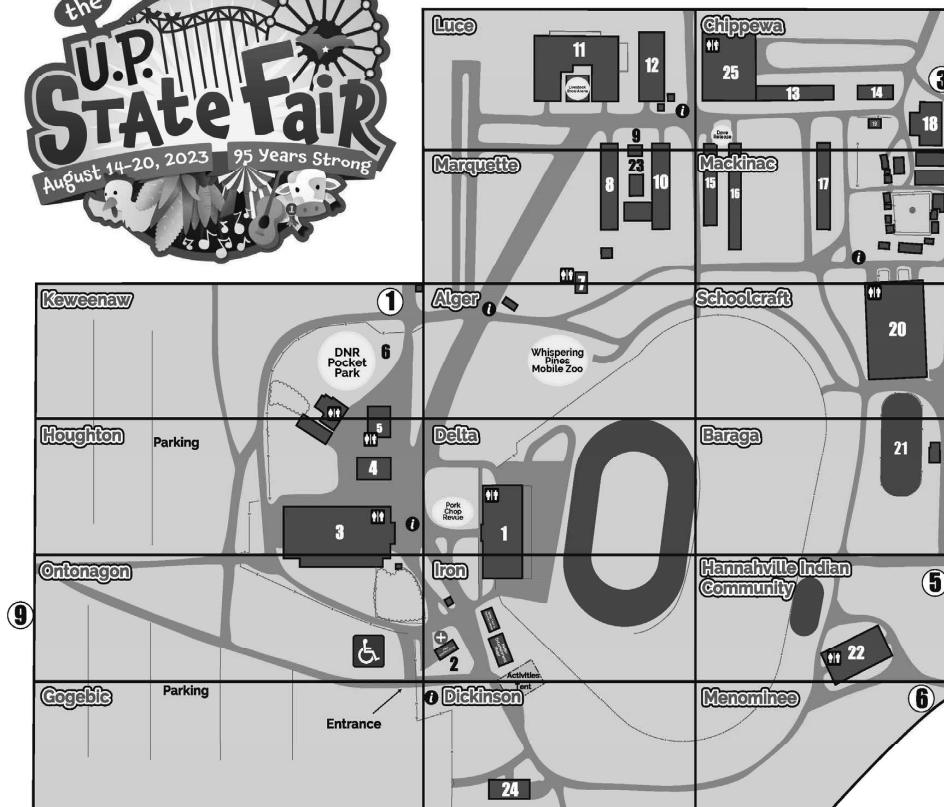

State Fair Authority. This includes, but is not limited to, disruptive behavior, poor sportsmanship, inappropriate language, inappropriate conduct, bullying and confrontations with any fair staff, other exhibitors or spectators.

As a parent or legal guardian, of a Junior exhibitor, exhibiting at the Upper Peninsula State Fair I agree to abide by the following: Maintain and promote a positive attitude towards the department's atmosphere and follow all barn rules.

- I agree to encourage and guide my child, my club member, and myself to conduct ourselves with honesty and good sportsmanship. I will ask questions concerning rules and policy in an appropriate adult manner.
- I agree to abide by the restrictions of the Class C Liquor License; alcohol consumption is limited to designated areas on the fairgrounds. I further understand that none of the barns or buildings are designated areas.
- Instead of participating in a retaliatory manner, I will follow the Formal Protest guidelines in the Upper Peninsula State Fair Premium Book.
- I will keep the intent and spirit of the Upper Peninsula State Fair, and remember that my child/club member is the one exhibiting, not me. I will place the emotional and physical wellbeing of my child/club member ahead of my personal desire to win.
- No adult or exhibitor will conspire with another person or persons to intentionally violate this code of conduct and Upper Peninsula State Fair show rules or knowingly contribute or cooperate with another person or persons either by affirmative action or inaction to violate this code of conduct or show rules.
- By signing this code of conduct I am accepting the responsibility of informing my immediate family members of the Parental Code of Conduct.
- Violation of the parental code of conduct will subject the individual (s) to disciplinary actions, up to and including, but not limited to; dismissal or disqualification, expulsion of the exhibitor.

- I will also not allow my parents, leader, or any other adult or minor to employ such practices to my animal(s).
- I have asked my parents, leader, or any other adult or minor to not break the rules on my behalf.
- I want my animal project to be an example of how to accept what life has to offer, good and bad, and how to live with the outcome.
I will respect my fellow exhibitors, and their project, and realize I have no right to disrupt or disturb their animal, barns or stalls. I further realize it is my responsibility as an exhibitor at the Upper Peninsula State Fair that I must report any or all unusual activity in or around any barn.

 - Following the Herdsmanship Procedure
 - The proper care and humane treatment of my animal (s), including exhibit cleanliness.
 - The production of wholesome food if my animal project is designated for market.
 - The care and grooming of my animal while at the UPSF.
 - Conducting myself with honesty and good sportsmanship.
 - Conducting myself to reflect the highest standards of honor and dignity to promote the advancement of agricultural education
- I understand and agree that when I, my parents, leader or any other adult or minor connected with my project or animal (s) break the rules, I agree to live by the final decision of the UPSF Management Team regarding disqualification of myself and /or my animal (s), loss of premium awards, auction proceeds, and my loss of future eligibility.

2. **Complete Livestock Entry Forms** (One form per exhibitor, one form per department.)
 - A.. All market steers, swine, lambs and goats **must** register online at <https://upperpsf.fairwire.com> by July 15th, and must also register for the correct showmanship and record keeping classes.
 - B. Include completed forms with your completed Exhibitor Fee Form.
 - C. Provide required information that applies to each department.

4. **Equine Exhibitors**
 - A. A mailed hardcopy of your Coggins test is due July 15th. The department Superintendent/staff will be checking horses against test papers upon arrival.

5. **Proof of negative cattle BVD testing with animal RFID number listed. BVD negative test, must match RFID #.**
- Department 3, Division 14, Highland cattle ONLY.
6. **All registered beef cattle must have breed registration papers upon arrival at the UPSF. Papers will be checked.**
7. **Junior Market Swine Exhibitors:**

8. **I have read and acknowledge the exhibitor and parental code of conduct.**

Any animal found to be in violation will be disqualified and any monies awarded to the individual, including premiums, prizes and auction proceeds will be forfeited. Welcome to the 2023 Upper Peninsula State Fair

We welcome you to the 2023 Upper Peninsula State Fair. Please carefully read the following information for key changes to this year's fair operation.

Notes for 2023

1. The daily/weekly gate admission includes general admission to the Grandstand entertainment. Reserved seating is available for some grandstand attractions at an additional cost of \$15.00 per person.
2. All exhibitors are required to purchase either daily or weekly gate passes.
3. One day horse show exhibitors will be required to purchase a daily gate admission pass for the day of the show.
4. Online registration for the U.P. State Fair will be available May 20, 2023. Registration can be found at <https://upperpsf.fairwire.com>. All departments and divisions can be registered online.

JUNIOR MARKET LIVESTOCK BOARD

Junior Market Livestock exhibitors with eligible animals for sale, as defined by the U.P. State Fair Exhibitor Guide are eligible to serve on the Jr. Market Livestock Board. An exhibitor must be at least 14 years of age, have been a junior market livestock exhibitor for two years, be willing to promote leadership and excellence among junior exhibitors and assist with the organization of the junior market livestock sale. Interested exhibitors shall complete and circulate a nomination petition signed by 20 junior market livestock exhibitors. Nomination petitions will be available at the annual meeting and should be turned in to the Beef Superintendent's office by **NOON** on Wednesday of fair week. Seven directors shall be elected by exhibitors (representing beef, lambs, hogs and meat goats) to serve on the board.

VEHICLE/STOCK TRAILER PARKING

1. Exhibitors are permitted to park near the barns between midnight and 9:00 A.M. ONLY. This is intended for a short duration to care for animals. Parking other than those hours is limited to superintendents and assistants (who are not camping on the grounds), judges, volunteers, night watchman. The department superintendents will determine who is permitted to park in the designated area near the barns. You must have a permit to park.
2. Exhibitors camping on the fairgrounds are required to park

at their campsite. Exhibitors not camping on the fairgrounds will be required to park in the infield of the race track, except between midnight and 9:00 A.M. Improperly parked vehicles, or those without parking permits, will be towed away at owner's expense. Misuse of parking permits may also result in parking privileges being revoked.

3. Stock trailers will be required to park in the designated area in the infield of the race track. Contact numbers for emergency access will be posted. Please Keep in mind, lack of pre-planning does not constitute an emergency. Stock trailer parking with 24 hour access is available near the North Coast barn.

EXHIBIT CHANGES:

1. All Community Arts exhibits (Departments 17-27) **MUST** be registered by August 1st. Registration can be completed online at <https://upperpsf.fairwire.com>. See Placement Times page for NEW exhibit placement times.
2. **Attention all Junior Market Livestock Exhibitors:** E-mails will be sent to all 2023 Exhibitors notifying them when pre-registration for the 2024 fair is available. Pre-registration dates: Steer-February 14th, 2024, Swine, Goat, Lamb-May 31, 2024.
3. Pee-wee showmanship— beef, goat, sheep: use entry form #0005.
4. All market steers, swine, lambs and goats **must** register online at <https://upperpsf.fairwire.com> by July 15th, and must also register for the correct showmanship and record keeping classes.
5. If the Grand Champion is disqualified, the Reserve Grand Champion will become Grand Champion. If the Reserve Grand Champion is disqualified, no other animals will be advanced. This rule applies only to the market steer, market lamb, market swine and market goat shows.
6. The U.P. State Fair has decided to discontinue the requirement that all bovine be tested for BVD PI animals. There continues to be a risk of contracting BVD at the fair and therefore the recommendation is to have all animals vaccinated with a product that provides fetal protection for BVD prior to exhibiting. This excludes Department 3, Division 14(Highland cattle).
7. There is no allowed scale tolerance when weighing in market animals and final weight is not allowed to be protested.
8. If a market animal does not make the minimum or maximum weight, the exhibitor may choose to get their alternate as long as they can arrive back at the fairgrounds before the scale closes at 5:00 p.m.
If a market animal does not make the minimum weight, the exhibitor may choose to bring their animal into the barn or designated area and the animal could be fed and watered. They would have until the scale closes at 5:00 p.m. to re-weigh and make weight. Should the animal not weigh the minimum weight required after reweighing, the animal will be removed from the scale, scale will be balanced and the animal will be immediately re-weighed. This is the final weight.
9. If an animal is disqualified before it crosses the scale the exhibitor may choose to get their alternate animal as long as they can arrive back at the fairgrounds before the scale closes at 5:00 pm. Animals pre-entered in Junior Market Livestock classes for steers, swine, lambs and goats must be housed in Michigan for the duration of the project. The animal must be owned by the exhibitor continuously from pre-registration date until auction sale day of the Fair. Ownership will be considered lost if the animal has been consigned or sold through

- an auction, even if the exhibitor buys back his/her animal.
10. The maximum weight cap for market swine is 325 lbs. to be eligible for show and auction sale. Hogs that do not meet the maximum weight requirement upon weigh-in must be removed from the fairgrounds by the exhibitor.
 11. No drugs shall be administered to livestock that are prohibited by State or Federal regulations. Animals under the care of a licensed veterinarian and/or taking any type of performance enhancing medication which may include but is not limited to steroids, diuretics, anti-inflammatories, tranquilizers, and pain killers are ineligible for competition, show, and sale. Exhibitors are responsible to read all product labels to make sure they do not contain such ingredients. Exhibitors must be aware drug residue may be found in the system longer than the labeled withdrawal time. Adequate time must have passed so the animal does not test positive for drugs during any testing during the fair or at the time of slaughter. Animals must remain free and clear of all such drugs during the fair or be disqualified from competition, awards, placements, ribbons, or sale. Animals requiring such treatments during the fair may be allowed to remain for public display only at the discretion of the superintendent and the UPSF staff veterinarian. Any and all questions should be directed to the UPSF Exhibitors Manager.
 12. Market animal new load out procedure: Procedure will be for a one-year trial basis. All times EST.
Swine barn: closed to public at 10:00 pm Saturday. Exhibitors done feeding and barn closed to exhibitors at 9:00 am Sunday. Packing house load out begins at 9:30 am Sunday. Self-haul released at latest time for other animals. Exhibitors allowed back in the barn after pigs are loaded out to retrieve any decorations/equipment, time to be determined
Steers: Decorations and equipment can be removed beginning at 10:00 pm Saturday until 1:30 pm Sunday. Closed to the public and exhibitors at 1:30 pm Sunday. Packing house load out begins at 2:00 pm Sunday. Self-haul released at latest time for other animals. After load out exhibitors will be allowed back in the barn to retrieve any decorations/equipment, time to be determined.
Beef Breeding: Breeding stock exhibitors can begin removing equipment Saturday at 10:00 pm and all day Sunday. Zones 5, 6 & 7 will have a release time of 4:00 pm Sunday. Remaining breeding stock release time is 5:00 pm Sunday.
 13. New classes added: Adult Rabbit/Cavy and Adult Poultry showmanship. It is a jackpot class with a \$5.00 entry fee and 100% payback for the first three places. Animals must also be entered in other classes.
 14. Department 13, all classes shall be judged using current breed standards.
 15. A survey will be given to ALL junior market exhibitors asking their grooming preferences for future fairs.
 16. Open Western & Trail horse show, Department 12 Division 6 will begin Sunday at 10:00 am

17. Goat show, Department 7 will begin Tuesday at 6:00 PM.
18. Market Chicken & Egg Auction will begin Friday at 6:00 PM.

EARLY RELEASE ZONES

Exhibitors residing in Zones 5, 6 & 7, will be have a release time of 4:00 P.M. on Sunday. This is for **BREEDING STOCK ONLY**. This does not include unsold market animals, poultry/pet stock or exhibits in the community arts department. Zone 5 is considered Keweenaw, Houghton, Ontonagon and Chippewa counties. Zone 6 is any county below the Mackinac Bridge. Zone 7 is considered all animals coming from out of the state.

FORMAL PROTESTS

Formal protests against an exhibit or exhibitor (s) will be accepted from an exhibitor for violations of written rules and procedures of the UPSF. The exhibitors' guide and other published fair policy serve as the source for rules and policies of the UPSF. All persons are strongly encouraged to settle disputes amicably without utilizing the formal procedure.

A formal protest must be submitted in writing, on an official UPSF protest form, to the Fair Management and accompanied by a \$100 filing fee. The filing fee may be refunded upon settlement of the protest. Forfeited fees will be placed into a scholarship fund. Formal protests must be submitted within 24 hours of failure to informally resolve the issues or within 2 hours of a placement.

Fair Management will forward the completed formal protest form to the superintendent of the department involved. The superintendent shall procure relevant facts regarding policy and make a resolution recommendation to the party or parties involved. This recommendation must be written on the formal protest form. Any recommendation that includes disciplinary action of one or more individuals involving loss of placements or premiums or removal of exhibit or exhibitor must be done in consultation with the protest board.

****Please note that a rule change request will not be honored after the premium book has been printed.**

APPEALS

An appeal may be filed by returning the same form to UPSF Management with a written explanation of why the proposed resolution was not acceptable. (Dissatisfaction with the level of discipline taken, is not an appealable issue.) The UPSF Management will forward the appeal to the protest board chairperson who will schedule the hearing for as soon as is prudent and necessary. The appellant must be present if requested. The decision will be made in writing and is final and without further appeal.

FRAUD or PROCEDURAL/POLICY VIOLATIONS

1. If demonstrable evidence establishes that a regulation, policy or procedure has been violated, or that fraud or deception has occurred in association with exhibiting in the fair, then the management and/or UP State Fair Authority, with or without recommendation from the DAC, shall take one (1) or more of the following actions;
 - A. Disqualify the exhibit in question.
 - B. Disqualify any or all other exhibits of the exhibitor.
 - C. Withdraw all premiums, trophies, awards or money won by the exhibitor.
 - D. Bar or restrict the exhibitor and/or exhibitor's immediate family from competing at the Upper Peninsula State Fair for a period of time to be determined by the Authority.
 - E. Impose any other penalties or restrictions deemed appropriate by the Authority including, setting probationary periods and requirements or forwarding the issue to legal authorities.
2. If the fraud or deception or other violation is discovered before final placing by the judge, then, in addition to being subject to the penalties provided for in Section 1, the exhibit will be declared disqualified by the superintendent or UPSF Management. If discovered after judging then the placing will be voided and the superintendent may re-order the placings as necessary.
3. If the fraud or deception or other violation is discovered after a market animal has been sold, then, in addition to the being subject to the penalties provided for in subsection 1, the money associated with the sale shall be remitted to the buyer. Other animals shall not be moved up in placing. In case any reward has already been awarded, the Authority will require the exhibitor to refund all premiums, trophies, awards, ribbons or sale money along with any other assessed penalty. Buyer shall retain possession of animal carcass.

UPPER PENINSULA STATE FAIR RULES AND REGULATIONS

The Upper Peninsula State Fair reserves to itself the power to make rules and regulations governing the use of the fairgrounds, and to set up rules and procedures for exhibitors entering fair exhibits or participating in fair events, and of which whether now made or here-in-after made, shall be binding upon all persons concerned. The Upper Peninsula State Fair also reserves the right to interpret all of the Rules and Regulations incorporated in this Premium List. Special rules take precedence over general rules if there is a conflict.

ADVERTISING RESTRICTIONS

Unless written permission is granted by the fair managing agent, under no circumstances will any person be allowed to place any advertising matter upon or within buildings, trees or any place on the grounds, nor will it be permitted to distribute advertising matter outside the place assigned them.

GENERAL RULES

1. The Upper Peninsula State Fair Management Agent reserves the right to interpret these rules and regulations and to settle and determine all matters, questions or otherwise arising out of, connected with or incident to, the operation of the Upper Peninsula State Fair.
2. By disregarding or violating any of these rules or regulations, any exhibitor or contestant forfeits all premiums, rights, and will be subjected to such penalty as the Upper Peninsula State Fair may order.
3. If doubt arises as to the meaning or application of a rule, the management agent shall interpret the same. A request for an opinion, by either an exhibitor or judge, shall be made in writing and submitted to Fair Office.
4. Entry is "open to the world" except Junior Market Livestock classes which are open to Michigan residents only.
5. The Upper Peninsula State Fair reserves the right to deny, accept conditionally, and to cancel any entries and Awards of prizes without cause and without claims for damages. Cancellation or additional entries will not be permitted after entry closing date, unless special permission is granted by fair management agent.
6. Exhibits in each department must be in place for exhibition at the time specified. Violation of this rule will forfeit any premiums won. Exhibitors arriving late will be excluded from exhibition, except in the case of exhibitors being unavoidably detained, reasonable proof thereof to be shown by exhibitor and contact made to superintendent.
7. All livestock are fair exhibits, and are to be housed inside appropriate barn for the duration of the fair. An exhibit must be on the fairgrounds for duration of the fair to be eligible to receive premium awards. (Exceptions are noted in Department Rules)
8. Exhibitors must be 9 years of age by January 1 of the year of the fair to be eligible to compete in the classes of the open show. (Exceptions are noted in Department Rules)
9. **See the department rules for release times.**
10. Exhibits shall be removed from the fair premises at the time specified unless authorization to remain on the fairgrounds has been approved by the fair management agent. An exhibitor violating this rule shall forfeit all fees, rights and privileges.
11. The Upper Peninsula State Fair Management agent reserves the right to change the time of release in any or all departments. This rule will have precedence over all other regulations regarding release of exhibits.
12. Still exhibits remaining after the fair may be picked up on Monday post fair, between 10:00 A.M. - 2:00 P.M. at the fair office. Items left beyond August 31 will be disposed.
13. Each superintendent, under the direction of the fair management agent, shall have full charge of the department to

which he/she may be assigned. Exhibitors must follow orders relating to placing exhibits, showing etc. Every precaution will be taken, but no responsibility will be taken by the fair in case of loss or damage.

14. If there is any question to the regularity of an entry or the right of any animal or article to compete in any class, the matter shall be submitted to the department superintendent for decision.
15. The superintendent shall check for accuracy, exhibitor's social security number (last 4), class numbers, exhibit description and award placement.
16. Judges will report to the superintendent immediately prior to judging. No person shall act as judge in any case in which he may be interested as an exhibitor. If such case should be presented, the superintendent, with the approval of the fair management agent, may remove judge, or substitute another judge temporarily.
17. Judges are instructed that if they have good reason to believe that any exhibitor is attempting to deceive the judges or the public to obtain a premium by misrepresentation, they shall report the facts at once to the superintendent.
18. An exhibitor who insults a judge in any manner or influences another person to do so shall forfeit all premiums and be excluded from exhibiting.
19. The decision of the judges shall be final. A premium Ribbon placed on the exhibit is no guarantee of award. It is governed by records on judges books.
20. Objection to any person serving as judge must be submitted to the superintendent in writing, prior to making any award, giving good and sufficient reasons therefore. The superintendent shall refer this to the fair management agent who shall have full power to act.
21. Acceptance of livestock entries received after July 15th deadline will be based on the following criteria:
 - A. Availability in the barns must be determined before Late entries will be considered.
 - B. A late fee of \$100.00 per exhibitor will be charged for any entries received on calendar days between July 16-July 20. Any entries received beyond July 20th will not be accepted, and will be returned to the exhibitor.
 - C. All late entries must be delivered to the UPSF office. If the entry is incomplete, it will not be accepted. All late entries will be placed on probation for the following year's fair.
 - D. All late entries for market livestock must have submitted a preliminary entry form by the deadline date (steers by February 15, lambs, hogs and goats by June 1)
22. An entry in any department, including entries made under the Danish System of judging, does not guarantee a premium award.
23. If an exhibit is entered and no individual class is listed in The Exhibitors Guide for this exhibit, it may be entered in the miscellaneous or Any Other Class Not Listed above classes, but all exhibits must compete as a group against each other.
24. Smoking is prohibited in all facilities.
25. Generators are not allowed in the barn (s).
26. Gate entry fees must be paid by all Exhibitors. This also includes all members for each Draft & Pony Pulling Team.

LIVESTOCK RULES

1. Entry of junior and open show for Departments 1-14 closes on July 15. Applications for entries should be made online at <https://upperpsf.fairwire.com>. No cancellations or additional entries will be accepted after entry closing date unless special permission is granted by the fair management agent.
2. Entry fees must be paid at the time of entry. Entry fees are non refundable.
3. Animals must be identified by diagram, picture, ear tattoo or ear tag number. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to have the animal identified on entries.
4. The department superintendent will be solely responsible for stall and pen assignments. Decorating of exhibit areas (beef, sheep, swine & goats) will be permitted with approval from the department superintendent. Decorations may include battery or solar powered lights.
5. All stalls and pens shall be kept clean and well bedded. Failure by the exhibitor to carry out this rule permits the Superintendent to have same done and charged to the exhibitor.
6. Exhibitors reserving stall or pens and not occupying the same on or before the time specified for the exhibit shall forfeit them and the stall or pen shall be subject to reassignment.
7. All Exhibitor stall space location will be determined by the Department Superintendent upon arrival at the fair. Space to be determined by actual number of animals to be housed on the fairgrounds **Assigned stall space includes tack area**.
8. No livestock will be housed on the fairgrounds prior to 8:00 A.M. Sunday Pre- Fair.
9. The contracted veterinarian may inspect animals as they arrive on the grounds or at any time during the fair.
10. The Upper Peninsula State Fair will furnish all feed and bedding for Dept. 10 & 11.
11. Exhibitors should provide their own forks, shovels, brooms, wheelbarrows, grain and watering equipment.
12. Any exhibitor detected of changing an ear tag falsely, misrepresenting ownership, or other infraction of rules will be excluded from competition and awards. Market animals are subject to random DNA identification testing at any time by UPSF officials.
13. Substitution of animals within the same breeding class entered for reasons satisfactory to the superintendent, will be permitted if made on or before the day prior to the opening of the fair, providing the animal to be substituted was owned by the exhibitor at the time the entries closed.
14. The superintendent will direct the calling of classes for judging in accordance with the printed program.
15. The superintendent may exclude an animal from any or all competition if there is an unnecessary or embarrassing delay by the exhibitor in bringing the animal into the showing. If an animal is not shown in its respective class, it will not be allowed to sell and premiums will be forfeited. All exhibitors must be ready and waiting in the on deck area when their class is called. The Department Superintendent will not hold the show for you, nor will the Superintendent/ Staff track you down for the show.
16. The superintendent shall not permit anyone other than judge, officials and showman in the show ring during judging.
17. If a Jr. Market Livestock Exhibitor is unable to be ringside during the judging due to a medical emergency, a substitute exhibitor may be used. Upon written verification of the emergency from a licensed medical professional, a Jr. Market Exhibitor (preferably a family or same club member) approved and designated by the department superintendent may act as a substitute exhibitor to show and/or sell the animal. The animal must meet all eligibility requirements and a completed set of record book must still be entered. The Exhibitors Manager and the department superintendent must be notified as soon as possible to request this exemption, with enough time allowed for the necessary medical verification (s). The medical emergency must have occurred after the July 15 deadline, and does not apply to the showmanship or open classes.
18. The ring clerks must ascertain the name and registry number of all animals shown in purebred classes and this must be shown on the judge's report sheets before payment of premiums will be made.
19. The superintendent shall instruct their ring clerks to indicate by proper check on the judge's report all animals that **ARE** or **ARE NOT** shown and to report all cases where registration or transfer certificates are not satisfactory.
20. Care and Grooming: Exhibitors are responsible for complete care of their animals. Livestock must be fed and cared for until they are released. Keeping the exhibit space assignment clean is the responsibility of the exhibitor.
21. All Beef Breeding exhibitors may remove any unnecessary equipment, tack and decorations from their display area **AFTER** 10:00 P.M. Saturday and all day Sunday. Animals are on display to the public until 5:00 P.M. Sunday.
22. It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to know the law regarding movement of animals coming into the State of Michigan.
23. Generators are not allowed inside the barn (s).
24. Please review the Veterinarian Procedures.
25. Exhibitors are responsible for reviewing of in state and out of state movement laws set forth by the State of Michigan for all animal transportation.
26. Due to animal wellness and safety concerns all livestock are restricted to the designated areas for that specie. Animals found outside of the designated areas will be immediately disqualified. Each barn must define their designated areas in their section of the premium book and make that information available and clearly displayed at the fair for all exhibitors.
27. Herdsmanship criteria and enforcement procedure located under Junior Show Rules applies to all livestock exhibitors.
28. The U.P. State Fair has decided to discontinue the requirement that all bovine be tested for BVD PI animals. There continues to be a risk of contracting BVD at the fair and therefore the recommendation is to have all animals vaccinated with a product that provides fetal protection for BVD prior to exhibiting. This excludes Department 3, Division 14 (Highland cattle).
29. No drugs shall be administered to livestock that are prohibited by State and Federal regulations. Animals under the care of a licensed veterinarian and/or taking any type or performance enhancing medication which may include but is not limited to steroids, diuretics, anti-inflammatories, tranquilizers, and pain killers are ineligible for competition, show and sale. Exhibitors are responsible to read all product labels to make sure they do not contain such ingredients. Exhibitors must be aware drug residue may be found in the system longer than the labeled withdrawal time. Adequate time must have passed so the animal does not test positive for drugs during any tests during the fair or at the time of slaughter. Animals must remain free and clear of all such drugs during the fair or be disqualified from competition, awards, placements, ribbons, or sale. Animals requiring such treatments during the fair may be allowed to remain for public display only at the discretion of the superintendent and the UPSF staff and veterinarian. Any and all questions should be directed to the UPSF Exhibitors Manager.

Health and Sanitation: Any violation of the following rules will automatically result in disqualification: (A) The use of drugs or chemical compound that is not approved by the Food and Drug Administration for use in meat animals is prohibited. Illegal administration of approved drugs and compounds is also prohibited. All animals are subject to blood, urine and tissue tests by the Upper Peninsula State Fair, FDA and USDA for illegal substances and substances that exceed the acceptable levels established by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, the Food and Drug Administration, the Food Animal Residue Avoidance Databank and Environmental Protection Agency. A positive test will result in disqualification. The exhibitor shall assume full responsibility for any violation of regulations related to drugs and medications to include withdrawal times and the condemnation or carcasses due to drug rule/regulations violations. This includes forfeiture of all premiums and market value of the animals. All premiums will be withheld until tests have been completed. (B) Any attempt to change the natural color of an animal, either purebred or crossbred, by changing the color of hair, fleece or skin at any point, spot or areas of the animal's body. False switches are permitted. (C) Misrepresenting the age of the animals for the class in which it is shown. (D) Minimizing the effect of cramps by feeding or injecting drugs, depressants or applying packs or using any artificial contrivance or therapeutic treatment except normal exercise. (E) Striking the animal to cause swelling in a depressed area. (F) Surgery of any kind performed to change the natural contour or appearance of the animal's body or hide. (G) Insertion of foreign material under the skin. (H) The use of alcoholic beverages in the feed or administered as a drench. (I) Criticizing or interfering with the judge, exhibitors, sale committees, superintendents and other show officials or other conduct detrimental to the show. The act of entering livestock in the Upper Peninsula State Fair is the giving of consent by the owner, exhibitor, and/or absolutely responsible person for fair staff to obtain any specimens of urine, saliva, blood or other substances from the animal to be used in testing.

LIVESTOCK HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Livestock shall be treated in a humane manner and in accordance with generally accepted agricultural and management practices for the care of farm animals and acceptable commercial practices to protect the livestock's health, safety, and/or welfare. The Exhibitors Manager shall notify the proper authority when cruel and/or prohibited conduct is observed.

The following practices are presumed to be a threat to livestock health, safety, and/or welfare; human health, safety, and/or welfare; or food safety, and are prohibited.

- a. Injection and/or insertion including drenching of any material into an animal for medical or non-medical purpose without examination and approval of the UPSF Veterinarian.
- b. Striking, beating, hitting, or otherwise contacting an animal that would induce swelling, changes, or transforms conformation or appearance of that animal.
- c. Applying any electrical, mechanical, or other appliance to livestock repeatedly or for a prolonged time period in violation of Section 313.2 of the United States Code of Federal Regulations.
- d. Performance of any surgical procedure to modify the conformation or appearance of an animal except for surgical procedures performed by a licensed veterinarian for reasons of medical necessity and/or standard animal care practices.
- e. Presentation of any animal suspected of retaining any testicular or accessory reproductive tissue whether by natural occurrence or surgical process.
- f. Administration or allowance of admission of a prescription drug to livestock, intended for terminal or part-terminal show, either before or during the exhibition unless the

prescription drug is administered under all the following conditions:

1. By or under the supervision of a veterinarian.
 2. In accordance with label directions.
 3. With an established veterinarian-client-patient relationship.
 4. For a valid medical purpose only.
 5. The timing of drug withdrawal can be followed without risk to food safety.
- h. Administration or allowance of administration of an "over-the-counter drug" to livestock, intended for terminal or part-terminal show, either before or during the exhibition unless the prescription drug is administered under all of the following conditions:
1. By or under the supervision of a veterinarian
 2. Under the supervision of the exhibitor and/or owner.
 3. In accordance with label directions only.
 4. For a valid medical purpose only.
 5. The timing of drug withdrawal can be followed without risk to food safety.
- i. Administration or allowance of administration of an extra-label usage drug to livestock, intended for terminal or part-terminal show, either before or during the exhibition unless the extra-label usage drug is administered under all of the following conditions:
1. By or under the supervision of a veterinarian.
 2. Used only as the extra-label directions provided by the veterinarian describe.
 3. With an established veterinarian-client-patient relationship.
 4. For a valid medical purpose only.
 5. The timing of drug withdrawal is extended as stated by the prescribing veterinarian on the label. And can be followed without risk to food safety. Animal must be past the withdrawal period to exhibit at the fair. Animals medically treated while on the UPSF fairgrounds will be disqualified to participate in their respective show or Jr. Market Sale.
- j. Administration or allowance of administration of a prescription, extra-label usage, or over-the-counter drug to livestock intended for a non-terminal show, either before or during the exhibition unless the drug as described is administered under the following conditions:
1. By or under the supervision of a veterinarian, if a prescription or extra label usage drug is used or by or under the supervision of the exhibitor/ owner, if an over-the-counter relationship.
 2. Use only as directed by the label or prescription.
 3. With an established veterinarian-client-patient relationship.
 4. For a valid medical purpose only.
- k. Food products obtained from livestock administered with drug shall not be used for human consumption. An example of a food product includes milk. The exhibitor is responsible of any violation related to the adulteration or possible adulteration of livestock or food products. A violation includes either of the following:
- i. Improper withdrawal times followed and/or condemnation of carcasses due to volatile drug residues.
 - ii. Taints and product quality issues.
- l. Due to the high transmissibility of fungal infections and for the protection of all species, and the public, no animals with ringworm lesions will be admitted into the UP State Fair. Determination and dismissal to be determined by the contracted UPSF Veterinarian.

- m. Because of the contagious nature of papilloma virus, to protect animals without them, animals with "warts" will not be allowed to exhibit at the UPSF. Determination and dismissal to be determined by the contracted UPSF Veterinarian.
- n. No animals with ectoparasites (lice, mites, etc.) will be allowed to enter the UPSF. Determination and dismissal to be determined by the contracted UPSF Veterinarian. Plan ahead when treating to ensure withdrawal times are met.
- o. The use of ractopamine (examples of some brand names are: Paylean, Lean Maximizer, Explode, XXL, Overdrive, Power-Max "not an all-inclusive list) is banned from use in animals exhibited at the UPSF.

Fair season is quickly approaching and as an annual reminder, USDA APHIS VS wants to remind sheep and/or goat exhibitors of the regulations for identifying sheep and goats in Michigan. Michigan law (Animal Industry Act 466 of 1988, section 287.711b) requires ALL sheep and goats to be officially identified prior to movement off their premises. If you have further question regarding scrappie, sheep and goat identification requirements, or the scrappie eradication program, please call the scrappie tag hotline at 1-866-USDA-TAG.

VETERINARIAN PROCEDURE

The UPSF maintains a veterinarian on staff during the week of the fair. The UPSF veterinarian and/or the State of Michigan Veterinarian shall be the final word on questions related to animal health issues, quarantines, and health related disqualifications or removals. The UPSF veterinarian/State Veterinarian may examine any animal or animal health records upon entry to the grounds or during the fair should health concerns or questions arise.

Animals exhibiting signs of illness should be reported to the department superintendent or Exhibitors Manager for the protection of all animals and exhibitors. Staff and management will do everything possible to notify a sick animal's owner prior to veterinary examination but may order examination and treatment to commence should the situation be deemed an emergency. Any treatments or procedures done by the UPSF veterinarian, except for examinations/sampling in conjunction with a show or contest, will be billed to the animal owner/exhibitor. Payment must be made to the UPSF office before the final closing of the fair or premium checks will be withheld and future fair entries may be rejected.

Exhibitors may seek and employ their own veterinary care during the fair at their own expense (including parking/gate pass). Exhibitors doing so must inform the UPSF veterinarian, department superintendent or Exhibitors Manager of animal (s) receiving medical care. Management reserves the right to consult with the UPSF veterinarian/State Veterinarian on questions regarding the eligibility, animal health, and removals and will follow his/her guidance and recommendations. Treatments made contrary to the UPSF veterinarian/State Veterinarian's recommendation may lead to disqualification or removal if he/she deems it necessary.

Health Requirements for Livestock Exhibited in Michigan

The complete set of requirements can be obtained from the Michigan Department of Agriculture website: Michigan.gov/mdard or by contacting the fair office. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing the requirements for movement of their individual species.

SUMMARY OF HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITED IN MICHIGAN

- All cattle coming from the Lower Peninsula of Michigan must follow the movement requirements set forth by MDARD. The Upper Peninsula State Fair reserves the right to modify and increase the movement requirements (beyond the guidelines) set forth by MDARD.
- Out-of-State Exhibitors of Livestock imported into Michigan for exhibition shall be accompanied by an CVI (Certificate of Veterinary Inspection or Health Certificate) prepared by an accredited veterinarian from the state of origin. Cattle imported into Michigan for exhibition shall have USDA approved official identification ear tags and the official ear tag numbers must be recorded on the CVI.
- All cattle (beef & dairy) must be identified with an RFID tag
- Horses must have a negative Coggins test
- Goats must be identified with an official USDA Scrappie tag
- Sheep must be identified with an official USDA Scrappie tag
- Swine must be identified with official RFID identification tag.
- Swine at a fair, exhibition, exposition, or show authority facility with a fever of 105° F is reportable to MDARD
- Poultry must test negative for pullorum before entering barn

BVD-PI exhibition rules

The U.P. State Fair has decided to discontinue the requirement that all bovine be tested for BVD PI animals. There continues to be a risk of contracting BVD at the fair and therefore the recommendation is to have all animals vaccinated with a product that provides fetal protection for BVD prior to exhibiting. This excludes Department 3, Division 14(Highland cattle).

JUNIOR SHOW RULES

1. Competition is open to any one between 9 years of age through the person's 19th birthday. Fair age is the exhibitors age on January 1 of the year of the fair. Hog, Lamb, Poultry, Goat, Rabbit and Department 27 exhibitors may compete at age 8.
2. The junior exhibitor will abide by the general exhibitors' rules of the Upper Peninsula State Fair and such special rules as set up in the Exhibitor's Guide to Classes and Awards.
3. "Danish Judging System" means a method of judging in which all entries are judged against an established set of standards. All of the entries meeting the standards may receive the same award. The Danish system, when used, will award premiums for an A (blue ribbon), B (red ribbon) or C (white ribbon) rating given each exhibit in each class. If, in the opinion of the judge, the exhibit is not worthy, no premium will be awarded.
4. Jr. Livestock exhibitors entering the showmanship class must own the animal to be eligible to participate in showmanship classes. Applies to Dept. 4, 6, 7, & 8.
5. Jr. Dairy Showmanship competitors must also show that animal in a Jr. Dairy class.
6. If the Grand Champion is disqualified, the Reserve Grand Champion will become Grand Champion. If the Reserve Grand Champion is disqualified, no other animals will be advanced. This rule applies only to the market steer, market lamb, market swine and market goat shows.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR LIVESTOCK RULES

1. Animals pre-entered in Junior Market Livestock classes for steers, swine, lambs and goats must be housed in Michigan for the duration of the project. The animal must be owned by the exhibitor continuously from pre-registration date until auction sale day of the Fair. Ownership will be considered lost if the animal has been cosigned or sold through an auction, even if the exhibitor buys back his/her animal.
2. No drugs shall be administered to livestock that are prohibited by State and Federal regulations. Animals under the care of a licensed veterinarian and/or taking any type or performance enhancing medication which may include but is not limited to steroids, diuretics, anti-inflammatories, tranquilizers, and pain killers are ineligible for competition, show and sale. Exhibitors are responsible to read all product labels to make sure they do not contain such ingredients. Exhibitors must be aware drug residue may be found in the system longer than the labeled withdrawal time. Adequate time must have passed so the animal does not test positive for drugs during any tests during the fair or at the time of slaughter. Animals must remain free and clear of all such drugs during the fair or be disqualified from competition, awards, placements, ribbons, or sale. Animals requiring such treatments during the fair may be allowed to remain for public display only at the discretion of the superintendent and the UPSF staff and veterinarian. Any and all questions should be directed to the UPSF Exhibitors Manager.
4. Junior registered purebred animals will be checked for eligibility against the identification papers or from breed registration papers. Purebred animals must be registered in the name of the junior exhibitor, except in the case where the registration may be in the name of the family corporation or farm name. In the case of a partnership animal, the junior may show in the junior show and another partner in the open show. Fees to be paid in both departments and one stall fee.
5. Junior exhibitors shall wear leather shoes of suitable construction while in the show ring for safety purposes.
6. Junior market livestock exhibitors may exhibit more than one species, but shall be allowed to sell only one market animal, in addition to any/all Grand or Reserve Champion Market animals.
7. Each beef, hog, lamb and meat goat sold at the Jr. Market Livestock Sale will see a fee deducted from their auction check for use by the Jr. Livestock Committee for sale promotion and related sale expenses. Deductions will also be made to the Beef, Pork and Lamb Commissions.
8. The 2023 Livestock sale order will be Grand & Reserve steers, Grand & Reserve lambs, Grand & Reserve swine and Grand & Reserve goats, followed by all remaining steers, lambs, swine and goats.
9. Auction checks may not be received for up to one month following the fair.
10. All Auction and premium Checks for Steers, Lambs, Goats, and Hogs being submitted for DNA Verification and/or urine testing will be held until official results are received.
11. Junior Market Livestock classes are open to Michigan residents only.
12. If an animal is disqualified before it crosses the scale the exhibitor may choose to get their alternate animal as long as they can arrive back at the fairgrounds before the scale closes at 5:00 pm.

13. There is no allowed scale tolerance when weighing in market animals and final weight is not allowed to be protested.
14. **Junior Market Swine Exhibitors** must send a digital photo of their swine to jmarketexhibitors@gmail.com by August 1st. If a photo is not received by this date, you will not have a picture on the screen during the sale. **NO EXCEPTIONS!**
15. All market livestock exhibitors must compete in their respective showmanship and record keeping classes to be eligible to show in market class and to sell their animal at auction.
16. It is the Junior Market Livestock Exhibitor's responsibility to make arrangements for hauling and processing of any animals not sold through the Jr. Market livestock auction.
17. **All market steers, swine, lambs and goats must register online at <https://upperpsf.fairwire.com> by July 15th, and must also register for the correct showmanship and record keeping classes.**
18. Junior Market Livestock Exhibitors are limited to showing only one animal of each species in market steers, goat, lamb and swine shows.
19. If a market animal does not make the minimum or maximum weight, the exhibitor may choose to get their alternate as long as they can arrive back at the fairgrounds before the scale closes at 5:00 p.m.
If a market animal does not make the minimum weight, the exhibitor may choose to bring their animal into the barn or designated area and the animal could be fed and watered. They would have until the scale closes at 5:00 p.m. to re-weigh and make weight. Should the animal not weigh the minimum weight required after reweighing, the animal will be removed from the scale, scale will be balanced and the animal will be immediately re-weighed. This is the final weight.

17. HERDSMANSHIP CRITERIA AND ENFORCEMENT PROCEDURE APPLIES TO ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS.

To effectively promote projects and the agriculture industry to the public, the care and presentation of exhibits must be of high standards at all times during the Fair.

Every exhibitor at the Upper Peninsula State Fair will be monitored for exhibit herdsmanship by UPSF personnel. Herdsmanship will be based on decorations, appearance and cleanliness of display area, care given to animals, and general cooperation and attitude of exhibitor

Herdsmanship Criteria

1. Preparation of the Exhibit
 - A. Decorations - Neat and Attractive
 - B. Animal Arrangement - Animals correctly spaced and arranged (neither too close or too far apart Cattle)
 - C. Signs - Signs for each animal are appropriate and readable with complete information
 - D. Tack Area - safe and well kept
2. Care of Exhibit
 - A. Animals - Animals clean and comfortable
 - B. Aisles - Aisles clean and neat, adequate width for Fairgoers, no chutes, no wheel barrows.
 - C. Bedding - Bedding kept clean and odor free
 - D. Feed and Equipment - Neat and orderly storage, equipment clean and out of sight if possible
3. Appearance and Attitude of Exhibitor(s)
 - A. Knowledge and Courtesy - Friendly, able to answer questions from Fairgoers
 - B. Exhibitor Appearance - Clothes and person neat and clean, appropriate dress.

Exhibits not practicing satisfactory herdsmanship as determined by Fair management using the herdsmanship criteria will be subject to the following consequences:

- **1st warning** - Group contact or Independent exhibitor will receive a verbal or written warning indicating the exhibit needs improvement.
- **2nd warning** - Group contact or Independent exhibitor will receive a written warning indicating improvements needed in exhibit
- **3rd warning** - The Group contact or Independent exhibitor will receive a written letter of reprimand noting the lack of compliance presenting a positive image of the project to the public. **The Group or youth and their exhibits involved will be immediately released from the Fair and will lose all prize money or awards won. A report detailing the three warnings will be filed with the UPSF Fair Management. UPSF Management may recommend further disciplinary actions.**

2023 U.P. STATE FAIR JUNIOR MARKET LIVESTOCK RECORD KEEPING RULES

Market Livestock Record Keeping Competition: **In order to participate in the Junior Market Livestock sale, exhibitors are required to submit a completed market livestock record book and achieve a minimum score of 40 in the scoring rubric.** Failure to turn in a completed record book on time, will disqualify the exhibitor from the market class. If the animal is not judged in the market class, the animal will not be allowed to sell at the Jr. Market Livestock Auction. If the livestock project does not make weight, an exhibitor may still participate in the Livestock Record Keeping project.

The U.P. State Fair Junior Market Livestock Record Books will follow the Michigan 4-H Animal Market Project Record Book 2023 U.P. State Fair Version. These books are available at county Michigan State University Extension Offices and online at:

www.canr.msu.edu/delta/delta_county_4_h/u-p-state-fair-market-livestock-record-book or

www.upstatefair.net (Exhibitor tab).

Exhibitors will have three record keeping classes based on exhibitor's official fair age (fair age is the exhibitor's age on January 1 of the year of the fair):

Beginner (exhibitors 8-10 years of age for sheep, swine and goats) (exhibitors 9-10 years of age for beef) are required to complete the "2023 Michigan 4-H Market Animal Record Book U.P. State Fair version-Beginner Member".

Intermediate (exhibitors 11-13 years of age) are required to complete the "2023 Michigan 4-H Market Animal Record Book U.P. State Fair version-Intermediate Member".

Advanced (exhibitors 14-19 years of age) are required to complete the "2023 Michigan 4-H Market Animal Record Book U.P. State Fair version-Advanced Member".

Ribbons and premiums will be awarded in all classes based on the Danish System (A, B, or C). Trophies may be awarded in all classes. An interview will be required to determine trophy winner.

- Starting date for the market livestock record keeping project begins the date the animal is obtained.
- The final weight may be determined at home by tape measure or scale. This will allow the exhibitor to complete their record book prior to the fair.
- Record books are to be placed in the designated box located at the superintendent's office.

ALL MARKET LIVESTOCK RECORD BOOKS ARE DUE BY 1:00 P.M. MONDAY.

THE RECORDS WILL BE JUDGED ACCORDING TO THE SCORING RUBRIC FOUND ON THE LAST PAGE OF EACH RECORD BOOK.

Premiums and interviews for the Market Livestock Record Keeping project will be forfeited if records are not submitted by deadlines or are incomplete. If the records do not merit special distinction, trophies may not be awarded. Exceptions to the above rules may be granted by the Livestock Record Keeping Committee.

INTERVIEW (or all classes): A maximum of ten exhibitors in each class will be interviewed to determine the trophy winners. The objective of the interview is to identify the exhibitor's knowledge of their records. All interviewees will receive a rosette.

AWARDS: Trophies and rosettes will be awarded on Friday at 1:00 P.M. EST at the show arena. All record books will be available at this time. Individuals or a club representative must be present to collect their record books after the awards presentation. A question and answer session will be conducted at this session for anyone wanting to improve their record book.

RULES: EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR REVIEW OF RULES LISTED IN FRONT OF BOOK AND SHOULD BE SURE TO REVIEW THE VETERINARIAN PROCEDURES

1. An exhibitor may make two entries under one class entry, except in a group class.
2. All animals shown in group classes must have been entered in single classes.
3. Exhibitors shall inform superintendent of any reduction in entries one week prior to the fair.
4. Any senior yearling heifer in milk must be shown as a two-year old cow.
5. All cows three years old or over entered in breeding stock classes shall have borne a calf within eighteen months previous to the exhibition, or show satisfactory evidence of being with calf, or the cow cannot compete. Affidavits regarding breeding may be required and evidence of this fact satisfactory to the superintendent shall be furnished by the exhibitor if required.
6. Any cow that was last fresh 280 days or more prior to the day of the show may be shown at the option of the exhibitor in either the dry or milking class. A cow milked less than 280 days must show in the milking class, unless she is recorded as dry on the DHIA Record which must accompany animals to be shown in the dry cow classes.
7. First prize winners only are eligible for Champion prizes. Second prize animals may compete for Reserve Championships.
8. All cattle entered for competition shall be presented in the judging ring in their natural conformation and with no preparation other than feeding and fitting with the exception of any treatment of hair, hoofs, and horns.
9. All animals must be uncovered from 1:00 P.M. to 4:00 P.M. except immediately after washing or on day of showing.
10. The superintendent may require that all cows and heifers in milk be milked out not earlier than 6:00 P.M. previous to showing, and superintendent or judge may require any animal to be milked out in the show ring.
11. Hay or straw will be allowed in the barn per superintendent discretion. It must be kept outside and each exhibitor will be responsible for take care of his/her own supply.
12. A schedule of milking hours will be posted throughout the barn, and absolutely no milk will be taken into the milkhouse for cooling except during the hours shown on the schedule.
13. Animals shall not be washed while judging is taking place.
14. The show ring code of ethics as adopted by the Purebred Dairy Cattle Association will be followed. Copies are available from the superintendent.
15. All dairy cattle are to be identified by the RFID number.
16. The U.P. State Fair has decided to discontinue the requirement that all bovine be tested for BVD PI animals. There continues to be a risk of contracting BVD at the fair and therefore the recommendation is to have all animals vaccinated with a product that provides fetal protection for

BVD prior to exhibiting.

17. Milking times to be established by milk house superintendent. Anyone desiring to milk cows before Tuesday, August of fair week, 3:00 P.M. must contact milk house superintendent before Saturday Pre-fair.
18. If animal is entered as a dry cow and freshens after the July 15th entry deadline, it may be entered in class 8, 9, 10 or 11.
19. Dairy cattle coming in on Tuesday, must be unloaded and trailer parked by 12:00 P.M. EST
20. At the discretion of the UPSF contracted veterinarian, any animal specie showing signs of a transmittable or communicable virus or disease will be dismissed from the UPSF fairgrounds, and must be immediately removed from said fairgrounds. This may include but not limited to warts and/or ringworm.
21. Due to animal wellness and safety concerns all livestock are restricted to the designated areas for that specie. Animals found outside of the designated areas will be immediately disqualified. Dairy designated areas are the dairy barn, wash areas and the dairy show ring. Any other areas will need to have prior approval of the Superintendent.
22. See Herdsmanship Criteria and Enforcement procedure.

EXPLANATION OF TERMS IN THE DAIRY CLASSES:

BEST THREE FEMALES, any age, all are to have been bred by and at least one owned by the exhibitor. Each exhibitor limited to one entry.

PRODUCE OF DAM, groups to consist of two animals, any age, either sex, the produce of one cow. This dam must be named.

Animals need not both be owned by one exhibitor.

BEST THREE HEIFERS From Classes 1-5 for each section. All have to been bred by and at least one owned by the exhibitor. Can't be all the same animals as in the Best Three Females Class 21. Each exhibitor is limited to one entry.

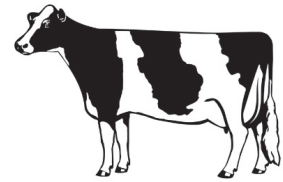
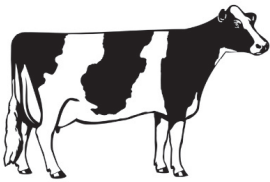

Exception: Current year calves are not required to be registered by July 15th, but must present registrations upon arrival at the fairgrounds. Proof of breed registration shall include all 2023 calves or animals will show in crossbred/commercial. (Division 9) Registered purebred animals must be registered in their respective registers and records. It shall be the duty of each exhibitor to present his certificate of registration and transfers for all entries to the superintendent. Transfers must be signed by secretaries of the registry associations and must show date transfers were made. The herd books and records recognized by the fair management include all American herd books and records of their respective breeds and all Canadian and European herd books and records that are recognized by the American Record Association for the same breeds.
- Registered animals shall not be shown in division classes.
- Unregistered animals shall not be shown in any division 1-8 classes.
- All bulls more than one year old must be secured by a ring or nose lead, or they will be barred from entering the grounds.
- First prize winners only are eligible for Champion prizes. Second prize animals may compete for Reserve Championships, except get of sire when groups are from different sires.
- Breed show schedules will be posted on Wednesday. Show order to be determined by the number of entries. The breed with the most entries will show first. Divisions 8 & 9 remain the same.
- In order to have a breed show, there must be a minimum of five (5) entries or animals will show in AORB (Division 8)
- All animals entered in group classes must be entered in single animal classes except steer and feeder calves.
- Open beef exhibitors must report to Superintendent prior to setting up displays or unloading or housing livestock.
- All Beef Breeding Cattle (Dept. 3 & 4 must be checked in between 8:00 A.M. - 5:00 P.M. on Sunday Pre-Fair
- Beef Barn will close at 11:00 P.M. to non exhibitors. Exhibitors may be allowed to stay in the barn until 12:00 A.M. providing there is sufficient volunteer security.
- At the discretion of the UPSF contracted veterinarian, any animal specie showing signs of a transmittable or communicable virus or disease will be dismissed from the UPSF fairgrounds, and must be immediately removed from said fairgrounds. This may include but not limited to warts and/or ringworm.
- All beef cattle entered in crossbred/commercial classes will

be weighed for class entries on Monday from 9:00 A.M. - 10:00 A.M. You must bring your cattle to the scale during these times. Classes will be posted Wednesday evening.

- The U.P. State Fair has decided to discontinue the requirement that all bovine be tested for BVD PI animals. There continues to be a risk of contracting BVD at the fair and therefore the recommendation is to have all animals vaccinated with a product that provides fetal protection for BVD prior to exhibiting.
- A ribbon placed on any exhibit, animal or article is no guarantee of a premium award. We must be governed strictly by the records on judges sheets.
- Due to animal wellness and safety concerns all livestock are restricted to the designated areas for that specie. Animals found outside of the designated areas will be immediately disqualified. Each barn must define their designated areas in their section of the premium book and make that information available and clearly displayed at the fair for all exhibitors. Beef designated areas are the beef barn, wash racks, designated grooming area and beef show ring.
- Exhibitors are asked to move shavings away from the walls prior to leaving the grounds on Sunday.
- NO feeding will be allowed in the wash racks and the area next to the show ring.
- A bulletin board will be located next to the announcement board where exhibitors may post items for sale, ie animals or other farm items. NO 'trademark' or 'branded' advertising is allowed in the barn per Advertising Restrictions in the Fair Book. A sponsorship packet is available for those businesses wishing to advertise at the fair.
- Prospect Steer Class has been changed to Prospect Steer/Market Heifer Class. \$20 entry fee will be due July 15th. Exhibitors will receive their winnings with their normal fair payouts. Prospect steer/market heifer show will be held 8 A.M. Thursday. Weigh-in time is 8 A.M. - 9 A.M on Monday.

American Highland Cattle Association (AHCA) rules for sanctioned shows.

AHCA policy statement concerning highland breeding cattle for the show ring. It is neither the desire nor the business of AHCA to act as a show ring policeman. It is however, within the scope of AHCA's responsibilities to maintain the integrity of the breed and its breeders. This includes the promotion of the breed in an attractive public setting by both amateur and professional exhibitors, building camaraderie and participation among owners and enthusiasts and encouraging selection of highly productive cattle with attributes of the Highland breed. It is also within the scope of AHCA's responsibilities to mediate and ensure the ongoing commitment within its constituency.

1. Exhibitors must be member in good standing of the American Highland Cattle Association or Canadian Highland Cattle Society.

2. All animals must be owned by the exhibitor and breeding stock registered with the American Highland Cattle Association or the Canadian Highland Cattle Society.
3. All shows will conform with IAFE code of Shoe Ring Ethics and show rules. (see www.highlandcattleusa.org).
4. Registration papers must be presented to show officials or AHCA representatives upon request.
5. Tattoos must be legible and correspond to registration papers
6. Use of hormones or steroids in animals exhibited is prohibited.
7. Fullblood breeding cattle may not be dehorned.
8. A calf in the cow/calf class must be the cow's natural calf, still nursing and a maximum of 250 days old. Both the cow and calf must be registered fullblood Highland Cattle.
9. All bulls 12 months or older must be shown with a nose ring or nose lead. PLEASE NOTE: We recommend that bulls be experienced with nose ring or nose lead prior to showing the animal.
10. **Registered** and **unregistered** market animals (both pure and crossbred) and **registered** Sovereign heifers, will be included for the number of animals in a point show.
11. Only **registered** pure and crossbred steers and **registered** Sovereign heifers will count toward the Premier Breeder and Exhibitor awards at all ROE shows.
12. Cattle registered in group classes Get-of-Sire, Produce-of-Dam and Breeders Herd must be registered fullblood Highland Cattle.

 - a. All fitting, clipping, grooming, blow drying, and applying product to the exhibit while on the fairgrounds **shall** be done by the exhibitor.
 - b. Each exhibitor may have one adult helper to instruct **(VERBAL ONLY)** with the fitting of the animal.
 - c. All Junior Beef Exhibitors may receive assistance from another Jr. Beef Exhibitor, that is participating in Division 1 or Division 3 of Department 4. However, the exhibitor must be actively participating in the grooming as well.
 - d. All fitting, clipping, grooming, blow drying and applying product to the exhibit while on the fairgrounds must be completed in the designated fitting area.
 - e. If needed, the exhibitor is allowed one person to assist with moving the animal to and from the grooming area and the show ring for safety reason
 - f. In addition to the exhibitor, one person may be present in the "on deck" area, to help the exhibitor calm the animal if needed.
 - g. All grooming on Tuesday will be done in the designated grooming area on the east side of the barn (roadside). **NO** grooming will be allowed on Tuesday in any other areas.
 - h. If you have a market steer and breeding stock, you may choose which animal to use for showmanship. All steer fitting rules apply to any breeding stock to be shown in showmanship. Exhibitor must own the animal.
4. Generators are not allowed in the barn(s).
5. Designated "Fitting Area (s)" will be established to ensure the safety of fairgoers.
6. Limit of 1 entry per class.
7. Steers must be born after January 1 of the year prior to the fair to be eligible.
8. Steers must be dehorned. Steers with horns will be disqualified.
9. Steers with Scurs exceeding 2 inches in length will be disqualified.
10. At the discretion of the UPSF contracted veterinarian, any animal specie showing signs of a transmittable or communicable virus or disease will be dismissed from the UPSF fairgrounds, and must be immediately removed from said fairgrounds. This may include but not limited to warts and/or ringworm.
11. Any animal which appears to be unsafe for exhibitors, other animals or general public will be dismissed and must be removed from the fairgrounds.
12. The Grand & Reserve Champions may be mouthed by a qualified veterinarian.
13. Steers must have a minimum fair weight of 1,000 lbs. to be eligible for show or auction sale. Steers not meeting minimum weight **may** be entered only in showmanship classes.
14. If a market animal does not make the minimum or maximum weight, the exhibitor may choose to get their alternate animal as long as they can arrive back at the fairgrounds before the scale closes at 5:00 pm. If a market animal does not make the minimum weight, the exhibitor may choose to bring their animal into the barn or designated area and the animal could be fed and watered. They would have until the scale closes at 5:00 pm to re-weigh and make weight. Should the animal not weigh the minimum weight required after reweighing, the animal will be removed from the scale, scale will be balanced and the animal will be immediately re-weighed. This is the final weight.
15. If an animal is disqualified before it crosses the scale the exhibitor may choose to get their alternate animal as long as they can arrive back at the fairgrounds before the scale closes at 5:00 pm. **(Steers need to be clean and dry before going on the scale.)**
16. There is no allowed scale tolerance when weighing in market animals and final weight is not allowed to be protested.
17. An adequate rope halter of 1/2 inch by 6 foot must be left on each steer Sunday evening, or a \$5.00 penalty will be deducted from the exhibitor's premium.
18. Classes of steers will be determined on the basis of weight, starting with the lightest weight class judged first. Each class shall consist of approximately ten steers.
19. Jr. Beef Exhibitors/Clubs must report to Superintendent prior to setting up displays.
20. Steers must be stalled between 11 A.M. – 5 P.M. Sunday PreFair.
21. There is no maximum weight, however, steers weighing over 1450 lbs. will be sold at the Junior Market Livestock sale at 1450 lbs.
22. **NO** feeding will be allowed in the wash racks and the area next to the show ring.
23. Beef barn closes at 11:00 pm to nonexhibitors. Exhibitors are allowed to stay in the barn until 12 am providing there is sufficient security.
24. Due to animal wellness and safety concerns all livestock are restricted to the designated areas for that specie. Animals found outside of the designated areas will be immediately disqualified. Each barn must define their designated areas in their section of the premium book and make that information available and clearly displayed at the fair for all exhibitors. Beef designated areas are the beef barn, wash racks, designated grooming area and beef show ring.
25. Grand and Reserve Market Steers will be required to be sold at the Jr. Market Livestock Auction.
26. All auction and premium checks for steers being submitted for DNA and/or urine testing will be held until official test results are received. Failure of any testing will result in disciplinary action as detailed in the FRAUD or PROCEDURAL/POLICY VIOLATIONS section.
27. Market steer exhibitors can remove decorations and equipment beginning at 10:00 pm on Saturday until 1:30 pm Sunday. After load out, exhibitors will be allowed back in the barn to retrieve any decorations/equipment. Time to be determined.
28. **Sunday (last day of fair) 1:00 P.M. Feed steers 1:30 P.M. Market steer area closed to the public & exhibitors 2:00 P.M. Large packing house animals released 5:00 P.M. Self haul animals released 5:00 P.M. Breeding stock animals released**
29. Order of Jr. Beef Show: Showmanship, followed by Pee Wee Showmanship, followed by Market Steers, followed by Jr. Breeding
30. **All Junior Market steer exhibitors MUST clean exhibit area down to the cement on Wednesday morning by 9 A.M. and Friday morning by 9 A.M.**

31. A bulletin board will be located next to the announcement board where exhibitors may post items for sale, ie animals or other farm items. No 'trademark' or 'branded' advertising is allowed in the barn as per Advertising Restrictions in the fair book. A sponsorship packet is available for those business wishing to advertise at the fair.
32. Breed registration papers will be required at July 15th registration for champion steer classes 262-268.
33. See Herdsmanship criteria and Enforcement Procedure for all Livestock Exhibitors.

JUNIOR BEEF BREEDING RULES

1. Limit **ONE** entry per class. (for Divisions 5-12)
2. In order to have a breed show, there must be a minimum of five registered entries or animals will show in all other registered breed classes. (Division 12)
3. **Exhibitors entering registered animals are required to provide breed registration numbers of the animal by July 15th with all division 5-12 entries and the registration certificates must be available for inspection upon arrival at the fairgrounds. Exception: Current year calves are not required to be registered by July 15th, but must present registrations upon arrival at the fairgrounds.** Proof of breed registration shall include all 2023 calves. Registered purebred animals must be registered in their respective registers and records. It shall be the duty of each exhibitor to present his certificate of registration and transfers for all entries to the superintendent. Transfers must be signed by secretaries of the registry associations and must show date transfers were made. The herd books and records recognized by the fair management include all American herd books and records of their respective breeds and all Canadian and European herd books and records that are recognized by the American Record Association for the same breeds. Animals with no proof of breed registration will show in section 13.
4. Unregistered animals shall not be shown in any division 5-12 classes.
5. All animals entered in group classes must be entered in single animal classes except for steer and feeder calves.
6. All entries in Section 13 will be weighed for class determination on Monday from 9:00 A.M.-10:00 A.M. **You must bring your cattle to the scale.**
7. All Beef Breeding Cattle must be checked in between 8:00 A.M. - 5:00 P.M. on Sunday Pre-Fair.
8. Exhibitors are asked to move shavings away from the wall prior to leaving the grounds Sunday.
9. Registered animals shall not be shown in Division 13 classes.
10. The U.P. State Fair has decided to discontinue the requirement that all bovine be tested for BVD PI animals. There continues to be a risk of contracting BVD at the fair and therefore the recommendation is to have all animals vaccinated with a product that provides fetal protection for BVD prior to exhibiting.

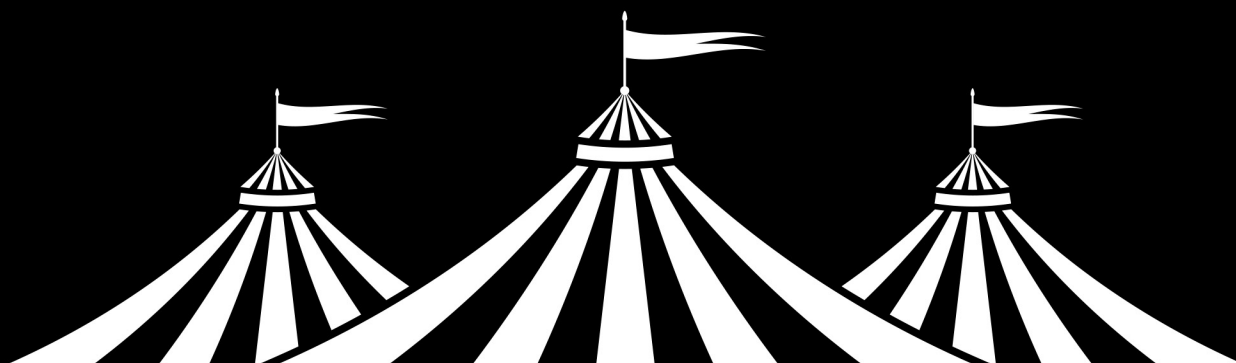

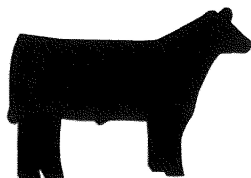

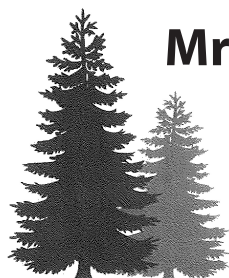

2. AS EXHIBITORS REMOVE THEIR BIRDS FROM THEIR SHOW
PENS AFTER 5:00 P.M., EACH EXHIBITOR WILL BE REQUIRED
TO CLEAN OUT THEIR SHOW PENS FROM ALL REMAINING
BEDDINGS. ALL BEDDING WILL BE DISPOSED OF IN THE MA-
NURE PIT OUT BACK. SHOVELS, BROOMS AND WHEEL BAR-

OPEN & JUNIOR POULTRY DEPARTMENT RULES:

EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR REVIEW OF ALL
RULES LOCATED IN FRONT OF BOOK & MUST REVIEW
THE VETERINARIAN PROCEDURES

1. Infectious Laryngotracheitis (ILT) vaccinated birds are not
allowed on the grounds.
2. All poultry (Open & Jr.) will be inspected for external para-
sites, communicable diseases, open cuts or sores, prior to
entering the barn. Birds found to have external parasites,
disease, open cuts or sores, will be ineligible to exhibit
and must be immediately removed from the Upper Penin-
sula State Fairgrounds.
3. All exhibition poultry with the exception of pigeons and
waterfowl must be tested for pullorum prior to placement
in the barn. The rapid whole-blood plate agglutination test
for pullorum, will be provided free of charge by state cer-
tified testers on the day of entry at the front of the barn.
Please be prepared to fill out the required testing form
upon arrival. There may be a short delay during peak
times of exhibit placement.
4. Out-of-state poultry other than pigeons and doves exhibit-
ed at Michigan fairs or exhibitions, must either be from an
NPIP Pullorum-Typhoid Clean flock with an accompanying
USDA VS 9-3 form ("Report of Sales of Hatching Eggs,
Chicks and Poulters"), or have a current official Interstate
Certificate or Veterinary Inspection (ICVI) and be tested
for pullorum-typhoid within 30 days prior to importation
and within 90 days prior to exhibition in Michigan. Out-of-
state exhibitors must be able to provide this documenta-
tion at exhibition.
5. All birds must have been raised by exhibitor. No birds will
be accepted which have been purchased and brought in
just for exhibiting at the fair.
6. Entries are limited to four (4) entries per class, in a combi-
nation of not more than 100 entries per exhibitor.
7. No substitutions of birds or changes will be allowed after
entries have been made.
8. Pre-entry forms must list class number and proper identi-
fication of each bird entered for competition. A wrong class
number may result in disqualification of the exhibit.
9. Birds shown as single specimens will not be eligible to
form a part of a trio.
10. In addition to cash awards as printed, ribbons are offered
upon request.
11. Only the superintendent and assistants will handle the
birds and they will also check them in and out. All eggs
are the property of Fair Management and not to be gath-
ered by any one except fair employees.
12. Morning chores must be completed between 6:30 A.M.-
10:00 A.M. and Evening chores must be completed be-
tween 4:00 P.M.-6:00 P.M. or with prior arrangements with
the department Superintendent.
13. Exhibitors not cooperating with the superintendent and
barn staff in adhering to the barn rules in regard to clean-
ing of pens, feeding and watering of their animals will
have their premiums withheld.
14. All exhibits must be picked up by 7:00 P.M. Sunday, at
which time the barn will close.
15. Birds should be at least 4 1/2 months old except in meat
classes.
16. Open class exhibits may not be entered in the Jr. Show.
17. Poultry judges use the A.P.A. "Standard of Perfection" as
a guide to judge all poultry. Please refer to this standard
publication for your breed standards and weights.
18. This poultry show is an American Poultry Association
(A.P.A.) sanctioned show. Membership in the A.P.A. is not
required to show poultry at the U.P. State Fair. A.P.A.
membership information can be obtained from the depart-
ment superintendent prior to judging.

19. Open & Jr. Poultry Exhibitors camping on the fairgrounds or showing other animals, are responsible for the care, (feeding, watering & cleaning of the pens) of their exhibits in Department 10. On the day of entry, each Open & Jr. Exhibitor caring for their animals in this department will be shown an example of how their pens need to be maintained. Exhibitors will also be shown where the feed & water is located, where the manure removal equipment is stored, and where the clean bedding is stored. A daily sign in sheet will be posted in the barn for Open & Jr. exhibitors to record the times they entered the barn for pen maintenance. Please note that exhibitors are responsible for all entries under their family name.
20. Due to animal wellness and safety concerns all livestock are restricted to the designated areas for that specie. Animals found outside of the designated areas will be immediately disqualified. Each barn must define their designated areas in their section of the premium book and make that information available and clearly displayed at the fair for all exhibitors. Poultry designated areas are within the poultry barn.
21. See Herdsmanship criteria and enforcement procedure.

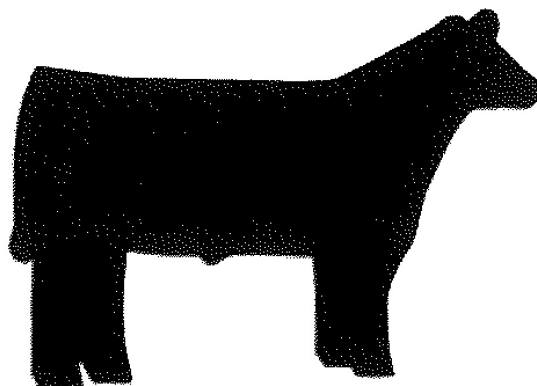
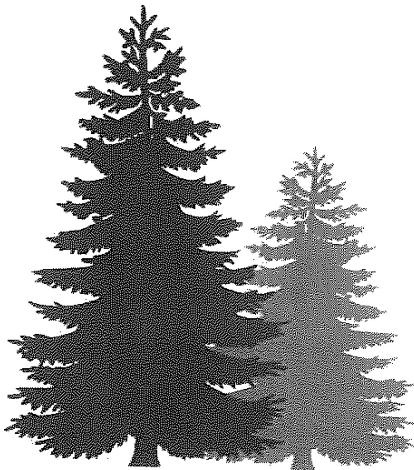

EXHIBITORS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR REVIEW OF ALL RULES LOCATED IN FRONT OF BOOK & MUST REVIEW THE VETERINARIAN PROCEDURES.

1. Jr. Exhibitors will be required to be present and participate in the judging. Jr. Exhibitors will be required to bring their rabbit(s) to the judging table. Jr. Exhibitors that are not present will be considered a "No Show" and will be disqualified from judging. **(There will be no "coop" judging). Jr. exhibitors that are unable to be present during breed judging will be required to have another junior exhibitor bring their rabbit(s) to the judging table.**
2. Open rabbit show exhibitors are strongly encouraged to participate in the judging process by bringing their exhibit to the judging table. If an exhibitor is unable to participate, a volunteer will bring the rabbit to the judging table. **(There will be no "coop" judging)**
3. Jr. Exhibitors in the showmanship classes should be prepared for both Oral and Silent presentation. The superintendent will notify the exhibitors to the judges' preference immediately prior to the start of Junior Rabbit Showmanship. The Showmanship classes will begin with the Senior Showman, followed by intermediate, followed by beginning.
4. All rabbits (Open & Jr.) will be inspected for external parasites, disease, open cuts or sores, prior to entering the barn. Rabbits found to have external parasite, disease, open cuts or sores, will be ineligible to exhibit and must be immediately removed from the Upper Peninsula State Fairgrounds.
5. Rabbit judges use the ARBA "Standard of Perfection" as a guide to judging all rabbits. Please refer to this standard for your breed standards and weights.
6. Entries are limited to four (4) entries per class, in a combination of not more than 100 entries per exhibitor.
7. No substitution of rabbits or changes will be allowed after July 15.
8. Entry forms must list class number and proper identification of each rabbit entered for competition. A wrong class number may result in disqualification.
9. Rabbits shown as single specimens will not be eligible to form a part of a pen.

9. Dress Code; long pants with closed toe leather type shoes. NO SHORTS
10. At the signal of the contest start, the team will have 45 minutes to prepare their animal. The remaining time left in the contest will be announced periodically throughout the 45 minute period.
11. At the signal of the contest end, all team members must immediately stop working on their animal. Failure to stop at the signal will result in an automatic disqualification.
12. At the conclusion of the fitting, each entry will be held at the designated area by one team member. The remaining team members must be beside the animal, but are not allowed to fit the animal.
13. Audience members are not allowed in the designated area, and are not allowed to communicate with the team members/ participants in any manner.
14. A panel of judges will use score cards in the following areas;
